

GRADUATE ENGLISH STUDENTS' STRIKE DECLARATION

In response to the dramatic expansion of the Indochina War and to the President's usurpation of power delegated to Congress by the Constitution, and to the violent suppression of dissent in Kent, Ohio, we, the English Graduate Association, support the following University actions:

1. A general strike to continue at least through Saturday.
2. A convocation of all students, faculty and staff to discuss actions necessary to the ending of this war.

We also resolve to support and participate in local actions in sympathy with the mass protest and march to take place in Washington this Saturday. Finally, we have declared Wheeler Hall and all its facilities OPEN to the community to provide space for strike planning and action.

This is a copy of a telegram to be sent to George Brown, U.S. Representative. It will be sent the evening of May 6, 1970. Please sign, and return this to a box in 303 Wheeler before 5PM tomorrow. We also ask that you contribute 25¢ to cover the cost of sending the telegram. The quarter can be put in the box with your signed telegram.

President Nixon's recent order to invade Cambodia and his resumption of the bombing of North Viet Nam is a blatant violation of the Constitution. The war in Viet Nam is illegal; the Constitution is being destroyed. Therefore, it is imperative that you vigorously pursue impeachment proceedings against the President. President Nixon is destroying our republic. We urge you to circulate this call for impeachment among your colleagues.

Business School

We further pledge as students to boycott any classes which might be held before that time and call upon our fellow students to join in this boycott.

Passed 126 to 46 at a meeting on May 5

We the students of Graduate and Undergraduate Schools of Business Administration of the University of California, Berkeley make a matter of public record our strong opposition to the recent intolerable decision to expand the war in Southeast Asia. More particularly, we object to the manner in which the decision was made and put into action without the benefit of, or concern for, the democratic process. As an education branch of the business community, we appeal to that community to withdraw its support for the government's decision and take positive action to dissuade Washington from its current perilous and divisive course. The membership had voted to suspend all regular academic activities to its efforts to that end.

Passed 106 to 11 at a meeting on May 5

Anthropology

The Anthropology Department, University of California, Berkeley, declares itself of strike in protest against the illegal invasion of Cambodia, renewed bombing of North Vietnam, and the murder of protesting students in Ohio by U.S. armed forces. We cannot continue education as usual while the forces of fascism and repression are escalating the offensive against peace and democracy throughout the world.
